This manual provides the safety, installation, and operating procedures for your toaster. Please read all of the information contained in this manual prior to installing and operating the toaster.

Your toaster is manufactured from the finest materials available and is assembled to our strict quality standards. This toaster was tested at the factory to ensure dependable trouble-free operation.

WARRANTY INFORMATION

Please read the full text of the Limited Warranty in this manual.

If the unit arrives damaged, contact the carrier immediately and file a damage claim with them. Save all packing materials when filing a claim. Freight damage claims are the responsibility of the purchaser and are not covered under warranty.

The warranty does not extend to:

- Damages caused in shipment or damage as result of improper use.
- Installation of electrical service.
 Normal maintenance as outlined in this manual.
- Malfunction resulting from improper maintenance.
- Damage caused by abuse or careless handling.
- Damage from moisture into electrical components.

Damage from tampering with, removal of, or changing any preset control or safety device.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

Use the following guidelines for safe operation of the unit.

- Read all instructions before using equipment.
- For your safety, the equipment is furnished with a properly grounded cord connector. Do not attempt to defeat the grounded connector.
- Install or locate the equipment only for its intended use as described in this manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals in this equipment.
- Do not operate this equipment if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, or if it has been damaged or dropped.
- This equipment should be serviced by qualified personnel only. Contact Antunes Technical Service for adjustment or repair.
- Do not block or cover any openings on the unit.
- Do not immerse cord or plug in water.
- Keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- Do not allow cord to hang over edge of table or counter.
- Turn the power off, unplug the power cord, and allow unit to cool down before performing any service or maintenance on the unit.
- The equipment should be grounded according to local electrical codes to prevent the possibility of electrical shock. It requires a grounded receptacle with separate electrical lines, protected by fuses or circuit breaker of the proper rating.
- All electrical connections must be in accordance with local electrical codes and any other applicable codes.
- Do not clean this appliance with a water jet.
- This appliance is not to be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge unless they have been given supervision or instructions.
- Do not allow children to play with the appliance.

WARNINGS


Be advised of the following warnings when operating and performing maintenance on this unit.

- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent or a similarly qualified person in order to avoid a hazard.
- Do not modify the power supply cord plug. if it does not fit the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.
- Do not use an extension cord with this appliance.
- Electrical ground is required on this appliance.
- Check with a qualified electrician if you are unsure if the appliance is properly grounded.
- If a chemical cleaner is used, be sure it is safe to use on cast aluminum. Observe all precautions and warnings on product label.
- Inspection, testing, and repair of electrical equipment should only be performed by qualified service personnel.
- This equipment is to be installed to comply with the basic plumbing code of the Building Officials and Code Administrators, Inc. (BOCA) and the Food Service Sanitation Manual of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).
- To ensure proper steaming characteristics, some calcium/mineral deposits must be present on the generator surface. If, during cleaning, the surface does become free of calcium/ mineral deposits, add plain tap water to the surface and allow it to boil off. This may have to be repeated several times to ensure proper steaming characteristics by creating a thin layer of deposits on the surface.
- Do not use a sanitizing solution or abrasive materials. The use of these may cause damage to the stainless steel finish.
- Chlorides or phosphates in cleaning agents (e.g. bleach, sanitizers, degreasers or detergents) could cause permanent damage to stainless steel equipment. The damage is usually in the form of discoloration, dulling of metal surface finish, pits, voids, holes, or cracks. This damage is permanent and not covered by warranty.

- The following tips are recommended for maintenance of your stainless steel equipment:
- Always use soft, damp cloth for cleaning, rinse with clear water and wipe dry. When required, always rub in direction of metal polish lines.
- Routine cleaning should be done daily with soap, ammonia detergent, and water.
- Stains and spots should be sponged using a vinegar solution.
- Finger marks and smears should be rubbed off using soap and water.
- Hard water spots should be removed using a vinegar solution.

INSTALLATION

Unpacking

- **1.** Open the large box. It contains:
 - GST-5V toaster
 - Accessories box
- 2. Remove the accessories box from the large box.
- 3. With the help of another person, carefully remove the GST-5V from the large box.
- **4.** Remove all protective coverings from the unit.
- 5. Open the Accessories Box. It contains:
 - Owner's Manual
 - Bun Buffer Frame
- 6. Wipe the entire exterior of the toaster and the accessories mentioned above with a clean towel sprayed with an approved sanitizer. Allow to air dry.
- NOTE: Handle accessories with care. If an accessory becomes bent or damaged, it may not attach to the unit correctly, which may affect normal operation.
- NOTE: If any parts are missing or damaged, contact Antunes Customer Service IMMEDIATELY at +1-877-392-7856 (toll free).

Location

When placing the toaster into service, pay attention to the following guidelines:

- Make sure power is off and the toaster is at room temperature.
- Do NOT block or cover any openings on the unit.
- Do NOT immerse cord or plug in water.
- Keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- Do NOT allow cord to hang over edge of table or counter.
- 1. Place the toaster in the required position.




Figure 1. GST-5V Components (Belts not Shown)

- 2. Attach the Bun Feeder and Bun Buffer Frame accessories (Figure 1).
- **3.** Attach the optional Top Feeder if present (Figure 1).
- Plug the power cord into an appropriate power outlet. Refer to the specification plate for the proper voltage.

Language Selection

Follow these steps to set the language option for the GST-5V toaster.

- 1. Plug in the power cord and turn the toaster on.




Figure 2. GST-5V Control Panel and Display

- 2. See Figure 2. Press and hold the MENU button for five seconds.
- 3. Press the LEFT ARROW button five times so that the display shows "English".
- **4.** Press the OK button.
- Use the LEFT and RIGHT ARROW buttons to select your preferred language. The available languages appear in the following order:
 - English
 - Spanish
 - French Canadian
 - French
 - German
 - Portuguese
 - Italian
 - Swedish
 - Russian
 - Mandarin Chinese
 - Japanese
- 6. Press the OK button to save the changes.
- 7. Return the toaster to service.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The GST-5V toasts Crowns, Heels, Clubs, and other products. Follow these steps to start the GST-5V:

- 1. Turn on the toaster and wait for warm-up to complete.
- NOTE: The toaster fans turn on after the A, B, or C Platen temperature reaches 66°C (150°F).
- 2. Set the Compression Knob to 4 (recommended). If you use setting 5, refer to Table 1 (page 8) for the required internal settings.
- 3. When the unit reaches operating temperature, the control panel displays "Ready".
- 4. Insert product into the designated area of the Bun Feeder Assembly with the cut side of the bun facing towards the front. Toasted product drops into the Bun Buffer.

Control Panel

The control panel (Figure 2) is located on the right side of the unit. The LEDs on the control panel light to signify when each item is operating. The Service LED lights and the corresponding LED (Motor, A Platen, B Platen, C Platen) blinks when the unit requires service. A message also appears on the display.

Settings

Follow the steps below to view and adjust the settings of the GST-5V.

- When the unit is plugged in, press and hold the MENU button (Figure 4) for five seconds. The control panel displays "A Platen." The display scrolls to show the actual temperature, SSR Duty cycle, and the setpoint. Example: A Platen: 271°C 35% 271°C
- NOTE: The unit does not have to be turned on in order to access the settings menu.

- 2. Use the LEFT and RIGHT arrow buttons (Figure 4) to scroll through the settings, which appear in the following order:
 - A Platen
 - B Platen
 - C Platen
 - Units (°C/°F)
 - Buzzer (Soft, Loud, Mute)
 - Display Languages
 - ET (Elapsed Time)
 - Controls Temperature
 - Motor
- 3. To change a setting, press the OK button and then use the LEFT and RIGHT arrow buttons to adjust as needed. Press the OK button again to save the changes. See Figure 4.

NOTE: The Elapsed Time and Control Temperature can not be adjusted.

The table below describes the settings for the A Platen, B Platen, C Platen, and Motor depending on the Compression Knob setting:

Factory Reset

To reset the unit to the factory default settings, press and hold the LEFT and RIGHT arrow buttons for 5 seconds until "Factory Settings Restored" appears on the display.

NOTE: For ALL Units, this sets the display temperature to °C (Celsius). Refer to the "Settings" section of this manual to change the display temperature to °F (Fahrenheit).



Adjusting Toast Quality

When the unit is turned on and ready, you can adjust the toast quality by pressing the LEFT and RIGHT arrow buttons on the control panel. After making an adjustment, test several products to verify they are toasting at the desired quality.

NOTE: This setting is maintained when the unit is powered off.

NOTE: If at any time the unit displays an error message or if it fails to operate properly, contact the factory immediately for service.

DAILY CLEANING

Clean the Toaster and Belt Wraps

- 1. Turn the toaster's power switch to the off position. The toaster enters a cool-down mode and will automatically shut down when complete.
- 2. Remove the top bun feeder (if present), bun buffer frame and bun feeder with heat-resistant gloves.
- 3. Remove the front and rear conveyor covers with heat resistant gloves.
- Inspect the front belts for any tears, 4. discoloration, or damage to the Belt Wrap snaps. Replace any damaged Belt Wrap as needed.
- 5. If the front belts are in good condition, spray a clean, sanitizer-soaked towel Sink Detergent solution. Wipe the front belt clean. Rinse the front belt with a separate clean, sanitizersoaked towel. Allow to air dry.
- NOTE: The belt rollers will continue turning while in cool-down mode. This allows you to clean the entire belt. Only clean the belts when they are in front of the Backing Plate to avoid causing damage to the belts. Repeat this step several times if there is heavy carbon buildup on the conveyor belts.
 - Inspect the rear belt for any tears, 6. discoloration, or damage to the Belt Wrap snaps. Replace a damaged Belt Wrap as needed. With proper maintenance the Belt Wraps can six months or longer.
 - 7. If the rear belt is in good condition, spray a clean, sanitizer-soaked towel with Sink Detergent solution. Wipe the rear belt clean. Rinse the rear belt with a separate clean, sanitizersoaked towel. Allow to air dry.



NOTE: The belt rollers continue turning while in cool-down mode. This allows you to the entire belt.

- NOTE: Only clean the belt when it is in front of the Backing Plate to avoid causing damage to the belt.
- 8. Wash, rinse, and sanitize the top bun feeder (if present), bun buffer frame, and bun feeder in the three-compartment sink.
- Wash, rinse, and sanitize the front 9. and rear conveyor covers in the three-compartment sink.
- 10. Reinstall the clean front and rear conveyor covers.
- 11. Reinstall the clean bun feeder. and bun buffer frame.
- **12.** Clean the outside surfaces of the toaster with clean, sanitizer-soaked towel sprayed with an approved degreaser. Rinse with a clean, sanitizer soaked towel and allow to air dry.
- 13. Place all used towels into the soiled towel bucket.




Figure 5. Bun Feeder



Belt is folded and creased. **Replace Belt.**




Belt is damaged and folded. **Replace Belt.**

QUARTERLY CLEANING

Remove Belt Wraps & Clean Rollers

- 1. Turn the toaster's power switch to the off position. The toaster enters a cool-down mode and will automatically shut down when complete.
- 2. Unplug the power cord once the cool-down period is complete.
- NOTE: Wait for the cool-down period to complete before unplugging the power cord.
 - **3.** Remove the bun feeder using heat-resistant gloves.
 - 4. Remove the front and rear conveyor covers by lifting up and away from the unit. Set the compression knob to 7.

NOTE: Reposition the toaster as needed to perform these steps.

- 5. Unlock the lock on the left side panel with a flathead screwdriver and open the panel. Set the bun compression knob to 7.




Figure 3. Conveyor Rollers

- 6. Push down on the front and rear belt rollers and move them away from the center of the toaster. Use both hands. This removes tension and locks the rollers in place. See Figure 3.




Figure 4. Conveyor Locks

- Lift the upper belt frame lock. Then rotate down so it rests on the camshaft of the rear belt roller. See Figure 4.
- 8. Pull down the lower belt frame lock (Figure 4). This provides access to the front and rear belt rollers and belts.




Figure 5. Remove and Discard the Belts DO NOT REUSE THE BELTS!

- **9.** Carefully remove both of the belts from the toaster (Figure 5).
- **10.** Wipe all four rollers and backing plates with a clean, sanitizer-soaked towel. Make sure to remove all debris from the rollers and the backing plates so they are as clean as possible.
- **11.** Use a dry cloth towel or nylonbristled brush to remove all debris from both side compartments, inside of the toaster, and underneath the rollers.

Install Belt Wraps

- 1. If you are installing the existing belt wraps, inspect the belts. Replace belt wraps if worn or damaged. If the belt wraps are in good condition, put them back on the toaster.
- 2. For new or existing belts, wipe both sides of the belts with a clean, damp sanitized towel. Allow to air dry.
- 3. Slide the belts gently over the appropriate top and bottom roller. Make sure the belt lines up properly on the rollers. The snaps on the belts should face the inside of the roller.
- **4.** Lift up both the top rollers. Use both hands. This will add tension and lock them in place.
- **5.** Lift the lower conveyor lock to lock the rollers into place.

NOTE: Lift up on the camshaft of the rear conveyor roller wile lifting the lower conveyor lock.

- 6. Lift the upper belt frame lock and lock in place on the conveyor assembly. Set the compression knobs to their original settings.
- 7. Close the side panel and lock the lock using a flat-headed screwdriver.
- **8.** Reinstall the conveyor covers and bun feeder.
- **9.** Plug the power cord into the appropriate outlet and turn the unit on.

ANNUAL CLEANING

Cleaning the Top Cooling Fan and Electrical Housing

Follow these steps to clean the top fan.

- 1. Turn the power switch to the OFF position. The toaster enters a cooldown mode and will automatically shut down when complete. Unplug the power cord.
- 2. Remove the optional Top Feeder (if Present). Remove the Bun Feeder.
- **3.** Facing the front of the toaster, move to the right Side Panel. Remove the 2 top screws from the right Side side Panel and lower the panel (Figure 16).
- Use a plastic brush or similar tool to brush all 5 fan blades from beneath. Be sure to remove all debris.

- 5. Carefully clean any debris from the inside floor of the control compartment and from all electrical connections. Be sure to remove any grease, lint, or debris from these areas.
- **6.** Attach the right Side Panel and secure with screws.
- 7. Resasemble the unit.

Cleaning the Rear Cooling Fan and Electrical Housing

Follow these steps to clean the rear fan.

- 1. With the unit off, remove the 3 rear screws securing the rear access panel and carefully lower the panel (Figure 17).
- 2. Use a plastic brush or similar tool to brush all 5 fan blades free of debris.
- 3. Carefully clean any debris from the floor of the toaster and from all electrical connections. Be sure to remove any grease, lint, or debris from these areas.
- **4.** Attach the rear panel and secure with the 3 screws.

NOTE: Be careful not to pinch wiring upon closing the rear panel.

5. Plug in the power cord, turn the power switch on, and test the toaster for proper operation.




Figure 6. Accessing Top Cooling Fan




Figure 7. Accessing Rear Cooling Fan

TROUBLESHOOTING

WARNING

To avoid possible personal injury and/or damage to the unit, inspection, test and repair of electrical equipment should be performed by qualified service personnel. The unit should be unplugged when servicing, except when electrical tests are required. If the troubleshooting steps listed do not solve your machine problem, contact Antunes Technical Service for further assistance or service.

LIMITED WARRANTY

These units are warranted to be free from electrical and mechanical defects for a period of one (1) year from date of purchase under normal use and service, and when installed in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations. To insure continued operation of the units, follow the maintenance procedures outlined in the Owner's Manual. During the first 12 months, electromechanical parts, non-overtime labor, and travel expenses up to 2 hours (100 miles/160 km), round trip from the nearest Authorized Service Center are covered.

- 1. This warranty does not cover cost of installation, defects caused by improper storage or handling prior to placing of the Equipment. This warranty does not cover overtime charges or work done by unauthorized service agencies or personnel.
